



HIP HOP TERMS

- Beat (beet) (noun) Pulse of the Music
- **Emcee** (em-see) (noun) master of ceremonies or person who rhymes their story to move the crowd.
- **Hip Hop** (hip-hop)(noun) Culture that includes rap, music, breaking, and graffiti art that was born in the Bronx, borough in New York City, N.Y. USA.
- Rhyme (rahmyn)(noun) A verse of words that sound the same especially the end, of words or lines of verse.
 - Internal Rhyme: found in the middle of a line:

The dog and the frog went on a **trip**Bags packed and walked to the **ship**

- Perfect (Strong) Rhyme: identical stressed vowel sound: "bean and green"
- Imperfect (Weak) Rhyme: linked words of Similar sounds: "ridge and fudge"
- **Rhythm** (rith-uhm) (noun) patterned of regular or irregular beats of music and also measured movement in dance.
